Sunday: International Topical Workshops

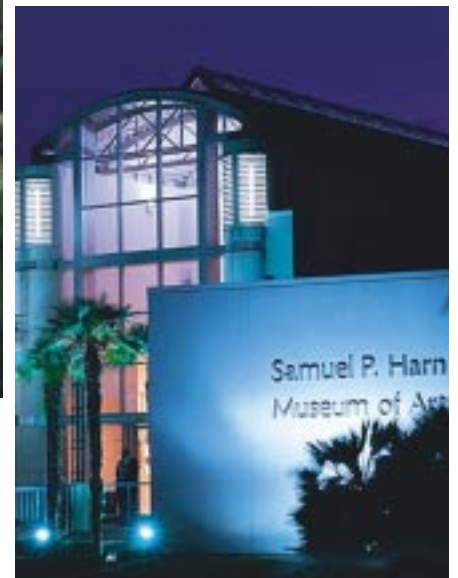
Provide a forum to initiate and outline international collaborations. Sessions will be aligned by topics.
